On November 1st, 2017, Yorkville High School inducted 76 students into the first chapter of Tri-M

Music Honor Society. At the ceremony, the Keynote Address was given by retired music educator Mr. William Jastrow. Throughout his 41 years in education, Mr. Jastrow has taught vocal and instrumental music, most recently in Indian Prairie School District 204. In addition, to being active as a clinician and conductor, Mr. Jastrow is widely regarded as one of the leaders in music advocacy, making him highly sought after as presenter and speaker.

Tri-M is a music honors society which allows student leaders of the music department to develop their role as "Modern Music Masters" through service and

outreach. The talented musicians in Tri-M reach out to Yorkville's community to enrich other's lives with music. These devoted students have also volunteered at district concerts, taught music lessons to younger students, and





organized public concerts. 


Mike Schwebke '09

Mike Schwebke, Yorkville High School Graduate, class of 2009, is an Illinois-based recording and performing artist on steelpan and percussion. He studied steelpan and percussion at Northern Illinois University under Liam Teague, Cliff Alexis, Robert Chappell, Mike Mixtacki and Dr. Greg Byer.



Mike is an active educator and clinician working internationally on different projects. In Illinois, he has students of steelpan, drumset and percussion. He has taught drumset classes at the Triple Threat Mentoring Organization and currently directs Oswego High School's Marching Percussion with Marisa Spevak. As a part of Paa Kow Band, Mike has been able to perform at Chicago's Old Town School of Folk Music on two occassions. He has taken part in a variety of clinics ranging



from the history of the steelpan to its future, other clinic topics have included

African and Afro-Cuban drumming traditions.

Mike has performed with Liam Teague, Dave Katz, Salah Wilson, Steve Grismore, Paa Kow, Ethan Bell and many others. Mike regularly performs around the Chicago and northern Illinois area. In the studio, he has recorded on drumset, steelpan and other percussion instruments. As a steelpan artist, Mike has been a featured soloist with the NIU World Steelband, has performed at PASIC in 2011 and 2015, and even traveled to Trinidad for Panorama. Mike and a small steelband of pan majors from NIU recently performed at the 2012 Hyde Park Jazz Festival and the Matthew Tembo World Music Celebration. In recent years, he has performed at festivals like Denver's City Park Jazz Festival, the Summer Solstice Indie Music Festival, Santa Fe Bandstand, the Montreal International Steelpan Festival. Mike endorses Vic Firth Drum Sticks and 63rd Street Percussion Cajons.

You can catch Mike performing at the Law Office Pub & Music Hall in downtown Yorkville where he hosts the monthly Jazz Trials. Mike also has a Caribbean Steelpan Jazz Show on December 15th at the Law Office.
